- The **registration deadline is June 11, 2010**. Class registration is on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- Submit separate registration forms for each child.

- Please enclose a \$75 non-refundable fee with each student registration. This fee is not applied to class fees. (Registration fee is waived for previously registered or current Guilford Day students.)
- At least 50% of the total fee is due by June 11, 2010. The remaining 50% is due by June 25, 2010. You may pay all of the fees with your registration.
- Guilford Day School reserves the right to cancel a class or session due to inadequate enrollment. Fees are refunded for any cancelled class.
- If you need to cancel a class, all but your \$75 registration will be refunded if we receive cancellation in writing before June 11, 2010. No refunds will be given after June 11, 2010.
- If you need to cancel an individual session for Academic Coaching or Multi-sensory Structured Reading, you must give 24 hour notice or you will be charged for the session. A message must be left with the Program Coordinator and the instructor. The session may be rescheduled based on the availability of the instructor.

Courses for Credit

Courses for academic credit are designed to offer high school students an opportunity to build strong study habits and organizational skills while making up lost credits. Students will work in small groups (average class size of 6) with an instructor for mastery of particular subject area. Portfolios will be maintained to record student progress. **Written permission from authorized personnel at the student's home school is strongly recommended. S.M.I.L.E.

Systematic Multi-sensory Instruction Language Experience

SMILE offers direct instruction and remediation techniques in phonemic awareness, decoding, fluency, reading comprehension, spelling, and sentence and paragraph formation through research based, specialized instruction. Skills are taught in an intensive, structured and individualized manner. The course methodology consists of pre and post-assessment individualized instruction, mastery learning, ongoing measurement, immediate feedback, task analysis, intensive practice, over learning, and generalization. Classes consist of no more than 4 to 6 students. Individual progress reports of skills introduced and mastered are sent home on a bi-weekly basis and a final report and post-assessment are mailed after the student's last day of class.

Diagnostic Services

Guilford Day School offers complete diagnostic testing which assists parents and teachers in determining a student's educational, social and emotional needs. The academic and psychological assessment provides a complete picture of a student, identifies strengths and weaknesses, pinpoints a student's current and potential level of performance, and identifies learning style. During testing, a comprehensive diagnostic interview is conducted. The student is individually administered a variety of tests and a comprehensive psycho-educational report based on test results is prepared and discussed with parents. Teaching strategies, remedial techniques and accommodation recommendations appropriate for that student are provided.

MULTISENSORY STRUCTURED READING

Our Multi-Sensory Structured Reading (MSSR) tutoring consists of remediation techniques and specialized instruction that is research based and multi-sensory. Programs used may include the Wilson Language System, Great Leaps Fluency Program, The Hill Center Methodology, and Orton-Gillingham. Skills are taught in an intensive, structured and individualized manner. The course consists of pre- and post-assessment, individualized instruction, mastery learning, ongoing measurement, immediate feedback, task analysis, intensive practice, overlearning, and finally, generalization. Parents receive a written report of progress at the end of the summer. We strongly recommend a minimum of 2 sessions per week.

(excluding the week of July 5-9)
- Times: Schedules are available Monday thru Friday based on parent requests and instructor availability.
- Sessions: 60 minutes
- Grades: Rising K - Adult
- Fee: \$440 for 8 sessions (\$55 per hour)
\$525 for 10 sessions (\$52.50 per hour)
\$615 for 12 sessions (\$51.25 per hour)

Academic Coaching

Academic coaching offers personalized one-to-one tutoring for closing the gap between ability and aptitude. Students work individually with instructors for 1 to 4 sessions per week. A personalized tutoring plan is written for each student, taking into account the student's learning style, strengths, and weaknesses. Parents receive a written report of progress at the end of the summer.
